Stamps In Action! Thank you to the many women who collected stamps over the summer for the Canadian Bible Society (CBS)! My husband Tim and I had the privilege of delivering the stamps to Toronto the day after Thanksgiving and meeting Kandis Cornwall, the society's new Volunteer Coordinator. Tim took our picture so you could "meet" Kandis and "be with us" as your stamps were delivered.

The Canadian Postal System was on strike part of this holiday season, so the Canadian Bible Society will be particularly grateful to receive stamps from us this year. Kan-

dis smiled at me and said, "Stamps are just like the Mites! They are small, but mighty!" The stamps are used to buy bibles for "The Key to Freedom" program; a mission to share the gospel with men and women in prison. The bibles are given to the prisoners by chaplains who report that God's Word is

having a mighty impact. Chaplain Bill reports:

"I cannot imagine this ministry being as relevant to the lives of the inmates we meet without the Keys To Freedom Bibles. We have seen more men saved in jail in the last two years than any other time, and the Canadian Bible Society has played an important role in that!"

So ladies, again thank you and please continue collecting! Just a thought, I asked our whole congregation to help us. We are asking for members to give us all their Christmas envelope stamps. Let's see what

GUIDELINES FOR THE STAMP PROGRAM

Stamps collected are combined to create "charity boxes" and are sold to stamp collectors and vendors. The revenue generated allows the CBS to purchase Bibles for Canadian prisons.

◆ 1 pounds of stamps = 6 Bibles for distribution

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLECTING

- KEEP THE STAMP ON THE ENVELOPE
- CUT OUT THE STAMP LEAVING ¼ INCH BORDER AROUND THE ENTIRE STAMP, CAREFUL NOT TO CUT THE PERFORATIONS
- PLEASE COLLECT STAMPS ON WHITE OR LIGHT COLORED ENVELOPES, NO DARK ENVE-LOPES
- ♦ ASK YOUR CHURCH, OR SOCIETY TO COLLECT THE STAMPS
- ◆ IF YOUR CHURCH IS COLLECTING, PLEASE PUT A STAMP COLLECTION BOX IN YOUR CHURCH NARTHEX, OR OTHER DESIGNATED PLACE
- ASSIGN A PERSON TO GATHER THE STAMPS AND TURN THEM IN AT ANY ZONE OR LWML EASTERN DISTRICT EVENT. IF YOU BRING THE STAMPS TO A ZONE EVENT, YOUR ZONE PRESIDENT WILL GET THEM TO THE DISTRICT STAMP COORDINATOR, SHARON McGUAN (MY CONTACT INFO IS ON PAGE 9 OF THE LINK).






The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all (2 Corinthians 13:14)



of creation declares God's glory in speech and songs of praises.



LWML Sets 2019–2021 Mission Goal at \$2.1 Million

ST. LOUIS, June 24, 2019 — The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) welcomed 3105 people with 691 as first timers to the LWML Convention in Mobile, Alabama, June 20–23, 2019, under the theme "In Praise to the LORD!" The convention theme was based on 1 Chronicles 16:23–24a.

Delegates to the 38th Biennial Convention of the LWML adopted a \$2,100,000 mission goal for the 2019–2021 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 21 mission grants as men and women respond in prayer and offerings during the next two years. LWML chose to support the following mission grants, pledging their support with prayers and mites (offerings) given over the next biennium:






