BORN IN US

An interesting theme of **Born in Us** was the basis for the mid-week services in our congregation this Advent season. I thought it would be good to share my thoughts on Jesus born in us bringing us guidance as we await His coming.

There are a few ways that we can categorize guidance. If you are a techie you might think of maps, GPS apps, or wiki pages. If you are talking in terms of people you might think of a mentor or someone who provides wisdom. Of course mentor-ing may prompt memories of times you were asked for your wisdom or guidance

and then the person just did what they wanted regardless of your good counsel. That can be pretty frustrating, especially when the choice makes the situation worse. I'm sure we have grieved Jesus when we have strayed from His good counsel.

What if good counsel was already laid out for you, perfect guidance to move you through life? A complete set of instructions to live by. If you did not have free will, you may live an absolutely perfect life.

What would your life experiences be like if you did not follow those instructions? Picture this analogy that is too close to the truth for me personally. If you are like me you sometimes doubt the directions your GPS app provides, and go in a direction other than advised. Sometimes I get lucky and it works out as I expected or even to my advantage. Other times I end up in traffic and become a bit frustrated. Perhaps angry would be a better description.

In life we sometimes steer our own path because we think we know better or follow advice that is questionable. As many of us can attest there may be some short-term joy in those bad choices, but the long-term consequences may not be what we intended or worse they could be disastrous.

Let's consider **Ps 31:3** "*Since you are my rock and my fortress, for the sake of your name lead and guide me.*" In terms of guidance Ps 31:3 has some deeper meaning that we need to explore about the guidance that God provides.

In Ps 31 King David is praising God, "*You are my rock and my fortress. Therefore, for Your name's sake, Lead me and guide me.*" More in tune with modern English, David is saying for your purpose Lord, lead me and guide me. An important distinction here is that it is for the Lord's purpose that he leads us.



You may be thinking this sounds familiar. You would be correct. The same Hebrew root to lead or guide to a watering place, or bring to a place of rest is in Ps 23

Ps 23:2 "He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters."

David has hit on an important characteristic of God. For those who trust in Him, His purpose is to lead us to a place of rest, a place where we are refreshed, that there is no more worry, there is only the looking forward to being in His very presence.

God's plan to get us from our struggling worldly life to a life of assurance in His good purpose is shared by Jeremiah.

Jeremiah 31:32 "...this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel ..., says the Lord: I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people."

This prophecy is pointing to a Messiah who's good purpose is to gather the people to God, to save the world. This is the covenant of a Savior to come into the world, to dwell in us.

God's good purpose was to fulfill the law that only leads to our condemnation and death. Because of His good work, His good purpose, we can live with Him for eternity. Jesus himself reminded us in Matthew ,"*Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.*" (Matthew 5:17)

Counselor's Article continued:

Jesus took the law, He fulfilled it, and raised the bar for us. He taught that the law was not just about our actions but also about our impure thoughts, the failings of the heart. He took all of those actions, things already done, and added the exposure of impure thoughts that lead us to death. He took all of this upon Himself to fulfill the law in our stead.

The law that was put in our minds, and written on our hearts is part of the good purpose that Jesus has for us. The Law may condemn us, however it has three good purposes for our well-being. It is a curb to help us from going astray, to hold us back from the temptation to chase after short term gains that can have tragic consequences. The law is also a mirror for us to reflect on our current state, to show us that we are not the perfect beings He intended so that we may turn back and follow Him. And of course the law is meant to guide us, to be the instructions for a perfect life, to encourage us to make good decisions that are pleasing to God.

Jesus came into the world to bring guidance, to dwell in us, and always pointing us to the way of truth. He not only fulfilled the prophesy of Jeremiah, he added good news to the law, not by abolishing the law but fulfilling what we cannot. The good news is the grace He added to the prophesy through His own sacrifice. This grace, His good purpose, leads to a place of rest, a place where we are refreshed, where there is no more worry, there is only the path forward to being in his very presence.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO MAKE A BANNER FOR THE 2023 LWML CONVENTION IN MILWAUKEE



The Banner Procession at LWML conventions sets the tone for the convention as it beautifully expresses the convention theme and highlights the God-given talents of our districts. As 2022 was the 80th anniversary of establishing the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, <u>you are being offered the opportunity to participate in a visual way to celebrate this anniversary</u>. You may choose to use a vintage banner designed for a previous national LWML convention or you may create a new banner using the 2023 convention theme and the banner specifications noted below.

- Finished banner size is to be 3' x 5'. Added fringe may be longer. You may not use the convention logo on your banner, but do base your design on the convention theme, "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations." You may use the convention colors (note the letter-head) or other colors if you wish. Heavy fabric or bulky items are discouraged, as your banner should be easy to manage when carried.
- Your district's name must be on the front of the banner, though it may be abbreviated. Use any size letters you wish. Place a small identifying tag naming your district on the lower left corner on the backside of the banner, to help identify your district banner when it is rolled up.
- Attach two ties to the back of the banner. One of the ties is to be at the center of the banner width, about 10-12" from the top. The second tie is to be at the center of the banner width, about 10-12" from the bottom. These ties should be long enough to tie a bow around a 2" pole. Note: Do NOT use Velcro to hold banner to the pole, as it has proved ineffective. Please use ties as described.
- A dowel used at the bottom of the banner must be tacked in place to prevent it from slipping out of the casing.
- At the top attach the banner to a 1" dowel with an eye screw on each end of the dowel. Please use a strong quarter inch or 8mm cord. Make a small loop at the center for hanging. Secure the cording through each eye screw, laying the cord flat along the dowel, with the small loop at the center of the banner. Knot the cord on the outside of each screw. Be sure to attach the cord tightly because it will stretch when the banner is hung. Please hang your banner before sending it to the convention, to allow time for stretching.

Practice carrying your banner before arriving at the convention. The Host Committee will provide poles and stands for the banner. In the future, we will provide information regarding registering your banner.

family of 7 children and 2 parents. It all started when a good-hearted woman came into the LADD Thrift Store and told of a family for whom she was purchasing items. She shared the circumstances. Some of our Bible Study members volunteer at the store and brought up the idea to give Christmas gifts to this family at the group meeting. The good-hearted woman acted as liaison between the family and the ladies' group and asked for a wish list from each member of the family, which ranges in age from a 22 year old college student to a 7 year old and the parents. Nancy H., who leads the bible study and is also a LADD volunteer, organized the items on the lists and asked the members to donate items of their choice. When other congregation members and friends and family heard about the project, they wanted to help as well. We received a Thrivent Action Grant to fill in any items that were not donated and extras, like groceries. On December 12, we gathered the donated gifts, organized

and wrapped them. The wrapped gifts were then packed in large plastic sacks for each family member and stored until December 22, at which time they were delivered to the family home. **We collected more than 80 gifts packed in 28 garbage bags**. At the end of our session, we all gathered in a prayer circle to give thanks to the Lord God who enabled us to share our blessings with those in need. We prayed that the Holy Spirit would work in



their hearts to bring them to a strong faith in Jesus our Savior.



"What Is Love?"

According to those who track these things, "What is love?" was the most popular religious search term on the internet in 2022 (7.48 million searches). That more than doubled the 3.35 million searches for the same term in 2019, when it also was number one.

If you type "What is love?" into your browser, you get lots of dictionary definitions, song lyrics, Youtube and music videos, movie quotes, pop psychology, neurobiological answers, advertisements, and proffered links to nefarious websites that offer substitutes for love. Google gives 14,130,000,000 answers in 0.55 seconds – about 2 answers for every person on the planet!

Buried somewhere in that morass, if you refine your search, you might come across what God says about love in the Bible (or you might go to a Bible-believing church to find out!) The Triune God has much to say about love, and much to show about it.

In the Old Testament we find God constantly exhibiting His "steadfast love and faithfulness" and gracious mercy to those whom He loves, even when they (or we) are less than loving and faithful to Him.

In the Gospel of John we find Jesus describing how God shows His love towards us: "As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him." Christians refer to the latter part of this passage as the "Gospel in a nutshell" because Jesus summarizes the good news of who He is and why He came to heal, teach, suffer crucifixion and death, and rise again to life, all to save us.

In his first letter to the believers in Corinth, probably about 55 A.D., the Apostle Paul describes the nature of love in Christ:

"If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging symbol. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.

"Love is patient and kind. Love does not envy or boast. It is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way. It is not irritable or resentful. It does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

"Love never fails. As for prophecies, they will pass away. As for tongues, they will cease. As for knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away.

"When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known.

"So now faith, hope and love abide, these three, but the greatest of these is love." 1 Corinthians 12:13

By so completely describing love's divine qualities, Paul reveals our immaturity. Yet he alludes to God the Father – who knows His children all too well – and *still* loves us, reaches out to us with His Word, and embraces us eternally because of Jesus, who offered Himself up for us all. You can believe it!



<u>LENT</u>

LENT, the Spring season, the lengthening of days:

In the first centuries after Pentecost, the birthday of the Christian Church, 40 days of the Spring season (excluding Sundays) were set aside as a time of preparation for the Easter Festival. The 40 days were in commemoration of the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert, enduring the temptation of the devil. And so the emphasis for the early Christians, as they prepared for Easter, was upon penitence and



fasting. As early as 325 AD, the early Church declared Lent as a 40 day fast prior to Easter Sunday.

Fasting is still a part of the Lenten season, but not mandated as it was for the early Christians. For us, fasting, giving up something for Lent can be of spiritual benefit, helping us to focus on true repentance for our sins, and our need for Christ as Lord and Savior.

"God, be mercíful to me a sínner." LUKE 18:13 "The blood of Jesus, God's Son cleanses us from all síns." 1 JOHN 1:1

Ash Wednesday, the Imposition of Ashes

In the Bible, ashes symbolize death and repentance. Ashes on our forehead, in the shape of a cross, marks us as a repentant sinner, trusting in Christ as Savior.

"You are dust and to dust you shall return." GENESIS 3:19

For Lutherans and many other churches, the forty days of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, and ends on Holy Saturday.

"Jesus, I will ponder now. On Your holy passion. With Your Spirit me endow, For such meditation. Grant that I in love and faith May the image cherish. Of Your suffering, pain, and death That I may not perish."

I'm fortunate that I have the opportunity and the privilege to fill in at vacant congregations getting to know the people and participate in special events.

In June I was privileged to serve at Faith Easton and to perform the Rite of Confirmation for four youth. The gospel reading for that week was from Matthew 9:9–13, this is when Jesus invited Matthew to follow him.

To bring the awesome power of an invitation into perspective I drew parallels between Matthew and Ebenezer Scrooge. Yes, my mind works in strange ways.

Scrooge was a miserly old man who had no problem with underpaying his workers. Matthew most likely had no problem overcharging people the amount owed for taxes. Both had a love for money, both had a position of authority in which they could serve others, however, they both most likely only served themselves.

As we know from the story, Scrooge was not liked, although his nephew Fred did try to reach out to him and invite him to Christmas dinner, no one was interested in being in his presence. We can be assured that Matthew was not liked as well. The obvious reason was gouging the people when collecting taxes. It was a well-known practice of tax collectors in Roman times. He was also a Jew serving the Romans in an official position. Perhaps for this he would have been even more despised, a collaborator with the occupying Romans. To the Jewish authorities Matthew may have been considered a chief of sinners, worst of the worst.

The third parallel we could draw between Scrooge and Matthew would be an amazing change of heart because of an invitation. An invitation to surrender everything that was evil in their life. An invitation to surrender essentially everything they had loved, that would hinder them from being of worthy service to others. An invitation to surrender everything that could not be carried over into Christ's Kingdom.

In calling Matthew, a tax collector, to follow Him, Jesus demonstrates that He had come "*not to call the righteous, but sinners*" (Matt. 9:9, 13). As a good physician, He comes not to verify their sinfulness, but to heal them with His grace, calling them to repentance, faith and a new life (Matt. 9:12). The same invitation is extended to each of us.

While waiting for our flight home from the LWML Convention I overheard an invitation. I could here one of our sisters sharing about the LWML and what makes the LCMS distinct.

It's exciting and uplifting to know that we have bold women in Christ willing to share the Good News of the Gospel when the opportunity arises.

May God continue to bless the women who engage with the mission and stand firm in the faith. Emboldened to reach out with an invitation to experience the life changing love of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING MINISTRY

In past LINK issues, the Heart to Heart – Sisters of All Nations, has been shared. In this issue we are highlighting another Special Focus Ministry – Deaf and Hard of Hearing.



One of the mission grants of the LWML Eastern District 2018-2020 biennium has enriched worship at Trinity Deaf Lutheran Church, situated ten minutes from Pittsburgh PA. Funds enabled the purchase of audiovisual equipment such as a laptop computer, projector, and sound equipment. Vicar Vincent Mroz uses this equipment to provide visuals for songs, parts of the worship service and Biblical teaching. The music that is produced with the audio equipment is louder with a lower range that allows the worshippers to feel the music. Rev. Ronald Breight states, "It is a wonderful setup. The worshippers have responded very favorably to the new equipment. Thanks be to God and the generous ladies at LWML."

The LCMS Ministry to and with People who are Deaf notes that "People who are deaf may have supportive families and friends; however, they are often the only person in the family with a hearing disability. This may lead the person to feel alone, even among so many individuals. Ministry that invites and involves the community of people who are deaf can bring a sense of belonging to the deaf person."

Why does a Christian rejoice in one's sufferings? And just as importantly, how?

"Now I Rejoice in My Sufferings"

In the Apostle Paul's letter to the Colossians, he writes: Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of His body, that is, the church, of which I became a minister according to the stewardship of God that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery hidden for ages and generations but now revealed to His saints. (Colossians 1:24-26 ESV)

Why does Paul rejoice in his suffering? Because he knows that God is working *through* his affliction... not in spite of it but *because of it*, even through it. Does that mean that Paul understood it completely and in every detail? No, but he knew that it was for the sake of the church, for the sake of other believers (perhaps including you and me), and potentially (probably) also for the sake of unbelievers who may yet come to knowledge of, and faith in, the saving power of Jesus Christ. That's why.

Will we always understand the "why" of our suffering? No, at least not on this side of glory. We are not promised that. However, in His grace and mercy, sometimes the Lord does reveal some of it to us in this life – such as to Joseph when he forgave his brothers and told them how his suffering at the hands of his brothers was for God's saving purpose (Genesis 50), even though neither he nor they thought of it at the time of Joseph's suffering.

In the midst of our suffering, it is often very hard to see God's purpose in it. **Very hard**! Did the disciples understand the cross as they saw Jesus suffer in His crucifixion, even though He told them multiple times, in advance, that the Son of Man must suffer at the hands of sinful men? It's hard to see past the pain – one's own, or that of a loved one.

No, the disciples could not see past Jesus' pain, nor their own fear, in the moment. Not even for three days; not until Christ's resurrection. What was God's purpose in Christ's suffering and death on the cross? Nothing less than the full atoning for all OUR sin.

So, what is God's purpose in my suffering or your suffering? We don't always know, we don't even usually know at the time. We do know that Jesus is with us in our suffering, suffering with us since we are members of His body... and *if one member suffers, all suffer together.* (1 Corinthians 12:26a ESV) And we hear the words the Lord told Paul when he pleaded repeatedly for the Lord to relieve one particularly burdensome affliction, *My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness.* (2 Corinthians 12:9 ESV)

This doesn't mean that we earn anything through our afflictions and suffering, but rather that the Holy Spirit is working through our afflictions and suffering – often for the sake of **others** who may see: a witness of our faith in Christ as we look to Him in the midst of affliction (inspiring faith in them), an opportunity to experience Christ-like empathy as they see our suffering (softening and molding their heart), and an opportunity to offer care, support and Christ-like service (Gospel-inspired good works).

You know that whatever God is doing, it is good, and it is a part of His plan of salvation for the world. So your afflictions DO mean something, because Christ is IN YOU, and by Christ's afflictions He is reconciling the world to Himself. Ultimately, that's how Paul, and we, can rejoice in suffering.

We have His promise that our sufferings and afflictions will end. By the power of Christ, you and I will stand before God, perfect and blameless on the Last Day. May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you always.




Young Women IN MISSION Reflections from our YWRS

My name is Sarala Vunnam, I am from Malvern, PA. I was blessed to represent Eastern District Philadelphia as YWR in 2023.






CHANGES TO THE LWML RECYCLING PROGRAM


