But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. 21 And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22 But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. 23 And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. 24 For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate. (Luke 15:20b-24 ESV)

The Parable of the Prodigal Son can also be called the Parable of the Forgiving Father. In **Malachi 3:7**, we also hear: "Return to me, and I will return to you, says the Lord of hosts." This is the Gospel Call for all who believe in Jesus to come home, to return to the Lord, and the

Lord will return to them. This is great comfort.

This is part of our mission as fellow believers in Jesus. Yes, we are called to share the Gospel onward, yet we also have the duty to share it with our own network of friends and family. It's not easy, it's not always comfortable. Blessings and Purpose

As the holidays arrive we're often reminded to count our blessings. Good advice. But what is our conception of "blessing"? What is the purpose of giving a blessing or receiving a blessing? We know receiving a blessing means something good for us, and if we just dig slightly deeper, we realize that it is something good from God. But is that all?

The biblical conception of blessing begins as a gift from God. From the very beginning of creation God blesses Adam and Eve and all living creatures (**Genesis 1:22 and 1:28**) *and* He gives them a mission and a purpose – "be fruitful and multiply…" (Perhaps it's worth noting that God didn't "bless" the sun, moon, stars and

plants in the same way.) So when we say every child who is conceived is a blessing from God, we're reflecting a truth that goes back a very long way.

Again, after the worldwide flood, "God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth...." (Genesis 9:1) Along with that blessing (and purpose), God promised every living creature that "never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." (Genesis 9:11)

And God developed His plan of salvation further through His great blessing of Abram: "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." (Genesis 12:1-3) The Lord's blessing was part of God's call to Abram – away from worshipping idols and to God-given mercy, grace and purpose. Here, God promises a childless man that, from him will come not only the people of Israel (and Ishmael), but that his descendants would fill the earth and all nations would be blessed through him – eventually also the great assembly of all believers in the promised Messiah – the worldwide church of the Christ – ultimately fulfilled through the incarnation, suffering, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus, the Messiah.

In Hebrew, the same word is used for our blessing (praising) God and His blessing us by giving us His good gifts. Paul opens his letter to the Ephesians with a prayer based on the Hebrew "Berakah": "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him. In love He predestined us for adoption as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will, to the praise of His glorious grace, with which He has blessed us in the Beloved. In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace, which He lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight, making known to us the mystery of His will, according to His purpose, which He set forth in Christ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in Him, things in heaven and things on earth." (Ephesians 1:3-10 ESV)

Through Holy Baptism we are united to Christ. In Him we are blessed, just as Jesus declared in the Beatitudes of the Sermon on the Mount (**Matthew 5**). I encourage you to read those blessings and see in them the purposes Jesus has for you in this life – to "bless" God by your faith, and to "bless" someone in your life with the love of Jesus.

Our Triune God blesses us by giving us good things (like life and the things we need to sustain life). He blesses us further with His promise of even better things (even more abundant life as we live in relationship to Him). He blesses us by inviting us to trust His promises as part of our relationship with Him. He blesses us by giving us purpose and direction in this life and hope for the life to come, through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. Let us reflect on that, and reflect it, these holidays!



NATIONAL LWML MISSION GRANT UPDATE

As of October 1, 2021, the total amount received toward the LWML Mission Goal of \$2,150,000 was \$724,437 with \$1,425,563 needed to reach our biennial goal. LWML EASTERN DISTRICT MISSION GRANTS UPDATE

We have paid **Grant #4,** \$5,000 to the **Barnabas Project** sponsored by Calvary Lutheran Church in Waterloo, NY. This ministry reaches out with the love of Jesus as they provide mattresses, box springs, bed frames, pillows, mattress pads, sheets, blankets, and bedspreads for children in need. We thank God that together we have reached this Mite Milestone.

Please keep current **Grant #5**, \$4,000 for **Christ Memorial Lutheran School** in Malvern, PA in your prayers. Christ Memorial is building and installing a handicapped accessible vinyl playground for the use of children in their preschool and the community. This project is being funded by resources from Christ Memorial and the LWML Eastern District.

The LWML Eastern District has until March 31, 2022 to fund our last two grants and reach our district biennial goal:

Grant #6, \$5,000 to fund the resource and devotional materials to further the ministry of **Celebrate Recovery** a ministry of Hope Lutheran Church, Levittown, PA.

Grant #7, \$1,500 to support housing needs for **Missionaries in Monrovia**, **Liberia**. This grant is sponsored by Trinity Lutheran Church, Utica, NY.

Prayer: Heavenly Father we commit the ministries of Christ Memorial Lutheran School, Malvern, PA, Celebrate Recovery in Levittown, PA and Missionaries in Monrovia, Liberia into Your care. We thank You that the LWML Eastern District has been brought alongside theses ministries to partner with them as the share the Good News of the Gospel. Help us be faithful supporters as we raise the Mites to fulfil our promise of support to them. Bless our efforts and may our gifts be used to Your glory. Amen.

a result, he conducted a combined Sept/Oct distribution of face masks to 1,000 widows in the villages using LWML grant money. He reported, "It was much appreciated, as I learned that if you are found with no mask you have to pay 10,000 kwacha [\$12.39 USD]. Even in hospitals you cannot enter without a mask."



"Peace to you"

In His resurrection appearances to His disciples which we will read on the second Sunday of Easter (John 20:19-31), Jesus says, "Peace be with you" as soon as He appears to them. In His resurrection He brings peace to the Apostles. Through the work of the Apostles, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, who He also sends, He brings peace to others, including ourselves. And through the mission work of the LWML and those you support, He brings His message of peace to others in the world... peace to the nations.... Ultimately,



His atonement brings peace to all.

Yes, there are barriers to the Gospel. We might ask ourselves (and those we're trying to reach with the Good News of Jesus Christ, what are those barriers that we put up?

Our first, natural (fallen) response is that "I don't need it." No one likes being called to account. No one likes being told that they're a sinner. So no one naturally wants a Savior from their own sin. But God comes back to us time after time, event after event, in His holy Word to call us to repentance and faith.

Sometimes a barrier to the Gospel is fear – fear of the world and what it says about God and Christ and Christians – or fear of being wrong (pride).

Sometimes the barrier is almost the opposite problem – that we feel so accused of sin that we can't seem to believe that God's grace is meant for me... that God's gift can't be free, and that it can't be mine. It seems to good to be true, so we don't trust that it is ours. (That's where the Sacraments come in to assure us that God is, indeed, delivering His grace directly to us.)

Yet Jesus overcomes all these barriers. He comes to His disciples through locked doors to bring them peace in the news of His bodily resurrection! After all, since He has overcome sin, death and the devil, do you think our fears and doubts cannot be overcome by Him? Previously, Jesus had told His disciples, "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." John 14:17 (ESV)

To a world drenched in war, division and strife, our Lord brings peace. Not merely in the worldly way of a "cease-fire" between enemies, not merely the absence of open war that is maintained by the strength of force of arms (or subjugation through force of arms), but through actual reconciliation – reconciliation with God, accomplished through Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. And this brings a peace that passes human understanding because it replaces hatred with love, enmity with kindness, fear with hope, threat with promise, and most importantly it replaces death with life – life beyond the absence of death – life as it was designed and intended by God to be – with Him. Through the cross and empty tomb of Jesus Christ, God overcomes the barriers to save us and bring us peace.

How to Prepare Stamps for the Canadian Bible Society Prison Ministry HERE IS HOW THE USED STAMP PROGRAM WORKS:

- Stamps collected are combined to create "charity boxes" and are sold to stamp collectors and vendors
- The revenue generated allows the CBS to purchase Bibles for Canadian prisons.
- 1 pounds of stamps = 6 Bibles for distribution INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLECTING:
- KEEP THE STAMP ON THE ENVELOPE
- CUT OUT THE STAMP LEAVING ¼ INCH BORDER AROUND THE ENTIRE STAMP, CAREFUL NOT TO CUT THE PERFORATIONS (If they look a little more than ¼ inch, please do not throw them out. They steam off the stamps.)
- STAMPS MAY NOW BE ON WHITE, LIGHT AND COLORED ENVELOPES. THE CBS IS NOW SELLING THE STAMPS TO CRAFTERS WHO LIKE THE STAMPS ON COLORED ENVELOPES
- ASK YOUR CHURCH, OR SOCIETY TO COLLECT THE STAMPS
- IF YOUR CHURCH IS COLLECTING, PLEASE PUT A STAMP COLLECTION BOX IN YOUR CHURCH NARTHEX, OR OTHER DESIGNATED PLACE

Dear sisters in Christ:

As my four-year term as a District-Level Pastoral Counselor for LWML Eastern District ends, I thank you for your partnership in the Gospel work that we are called to endeavor in while we sojourn towards our heavenly inheritance, washed in the blood of Jesus. So, as I leave this formal volunteer post with the women's auxiliary of the LCMS, let me encourage you with this pastoral directive going forward: "Keep the main thing; the main thing."

In St. Paul's final letter to Pastor Timothy, he gave this instruction to Timothy and future pastors: *I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. MISSION GRANTS

Delegates voted to approve a 2022-2024 Mission Goal of \$132,100, a Mite Goal of \$61,000, and a Grant Goal of \$30,500. Seven (7) projects for a total of \$30,500 will be funded over the next two years. The projects to be funded include:

3. GRANT B* \$5,000	Request to purchase/install Acorn Stair lift to assist disabled/ elderly to the 2nd floor for worship and fellowship at Christ Assembly Lutheran Church in Philadelphia. Requested by Member Roselyn Kamara, Philadelphia Zone.
4. GRANT E* \$5,000	Request to purchase food items for the Rose Cafe and the weekly outreach food pantry truck to the needy, through Lighthouse Women's and Children's Center in Niagara Falls, NY. Requested by LWML Member Sharon Wolff, Buffalo Zone.
5, GRANT H \$5,000	Request by the Mid Atlantic Branch Orphan Grain Train to fund shipment of a 40 foot container overseas. Requested by LWML Member Susan Bell, Philadelphia Zone.
6. GRANT M \$4,500	Request to rebuild windows and doors then install to Good Shephard Evangelical Lutheran Church in Haiti that was destroyed by earthquake in 2021. Requested by LWML Member Bonnie Sugrue, Buffalo Zone
7. GRANT C \$1,000	Request by Center 4 Hope Food Pantry to purchase hygiene products for guests who cannot access these using their SNAP benefits at the food pantry. Requested by LWML Member Sharon Fuerch Genesee Zone.


HOLY CROSS, CLARENCE, NY



COUNSELOR'S O R N E R

THE WORD OF THE LORD ENDURES FOREVER

My family and I returned from a visit to the Holy Land this summer. A highlight for me was seeing the Great Isaiah Scroll in the Israel Museum's Shrine of the Book in Jerusalem. The Dead Sea Scrolls, some of the oldest Biblical manuscripts, were discovered in the Judean desert near the Dead Sea between 1947 and 1956, many in caves near the ancient settlement of Qumran. They are about 2000 years old, dating from ~250 B.C. to ~67 A.D. Most are written on parchment (animal skin), though some are on papyrus. Most are written in Hebrew, though some are in Aramaic or Greek.

Most of the Hebrew and Aramaic scrolls found at Qumran were handwritten in the "square" Hebrew script or font, which is similar to that which I studied in seminary, and which was common in Judea during the time Jesus spent on earth with His disciples. A few scrolls, however, were written in "paleo-Hebrew" script, a very ancient script which resembles Phoenician script, which goes back at least to the time of King David (who reigned ~1010-970 B.C.) and King Solomon (who reigned ~970-930 B.C.), and perhaps even to Moses (who wrote Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy probably ~1446-1406 B.C.).

Although a few scrolls were found intact, most survived only as fragments. According to the Israel Museum, scholars have managed to reconstruct from these fragments approximately 950 different manuscripts of various lengths. About two hundred of these manuscripts are biblical texts. The rest include some apocryphal works and other non-biblical religious writings, such as materials for prayer, worship and devotions, commentaries, rules for the community, etc.

The biblical scrolls represent some of the earliest evidence for the biblical text in the world. Fragments of nearly all of the books of the Old Testament (also known as the Hebrew Bible) were found at Qumran, many with multiple copies, with the exception of the short book of Esther. (Arguably, the book of Nehemiah also was not found; the Hebrew Bible contains a book called Ezra-Nehemiah, and only one Ezra fragment survived.)

Prior to the discovery of the Dead Sea scrolls, the earliest full Hebrew text of the Hebrew Bible was the Leningrad Codex dating from 1008 A.D. That text was the result of the work of the Masoretes - faithful Jewish scribes in Jerusalem and Tiberias from the 6th – 10th century A.D. who preserved the tradition of God's Word by scrupulously copying it by hand, and then counting and comparing the number of words and letters on each page to make sure of no error. Many of the Qumran texts are nearly identical to the Masoretic text, which is the basis for most modern translations.

Some of the Dead Sea scrolls resemble translations of the Hebrew Bible, such as the Greek translations known as the Septuagint (~250 B.C.), and the Samaritan versions of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.

To me, the most interesting of the Dead Sea scrolls on display at the Israel Museum is the "Great Isaiah Scroll." Remarkably, this scroll of the Book of Isaiah, among the oldest found, was preserved in a clay jar in a cave in its entirety (all 66 chapters!), and it about 24 feet long. Scholars estimate that it was written around 100 years before Jesus Christ. Isaiah wrote about the coming of the Christ when he lived in the Kingdom of Judea about 740-681 BC, so this handwritten manuscript of the Book of Isaiah is four times closer in time to Isaiah's original

than we are to it!

Writing in ~66 A.D., the Apostle Peter, a witness of Jesus' resurrection, quoted from the Book of Isaiah: "All flesh is like grass, and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord endures forever." And this word is the good news that was preached to you." (1 Peter 1:24-25 ESV) Peter quotes Isaiah to remind us that the prophets prophesied about the grace that was to be given to human beings through the coming Messiah (Jesus), as Jesus suffered, died and rose in accordance with those prophecies, all for the forgiveness of our sins and the promise of eternal life for all who repent and believe.

Indeed, the Word of the Lord endures forever!
